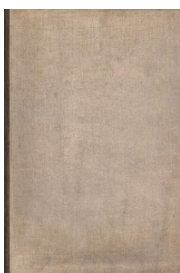


# Make music!

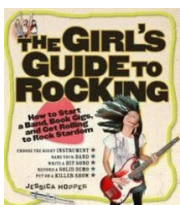

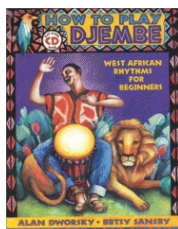
