The noted biologist describes his struggle with stuttering as a child. Grades 1-3.




A brand-new me! Winkler, Henry, 1945-

Hank's strength in theater arts help him fit into a new school, informed by the author's experience with LD. Grades 2-4.




Brothers and sisters Dwight, Laura.

A child with cerebral palsy describes where wheelchairs come from. Ages 3-6.



Silent days, silent dreams Say, Allen, author.

A fictionalized biography of James Castle, an autistic, deaf artist. Grades K-3.



Victoria's day Campos, Maria de Fatima.

This photo essay follow Victoria, who has Down Syndrome, to preschool and throughout her day. Ages 3-5.
