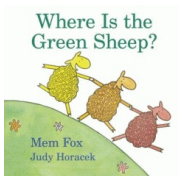


Baby/Toddler Storytime @ Milliken Mills: Vocabulary / I Know Words!

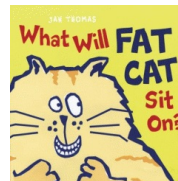

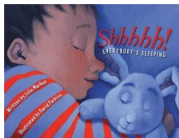

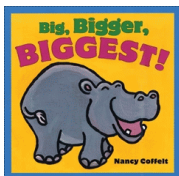
