Dashner, James, 1972-

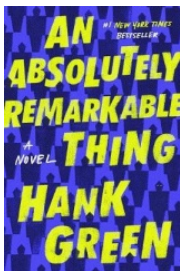
This is a fun, fast-paced action book. A quick and enjoyable read for anyone who likes YA.

Green, Hank, author.

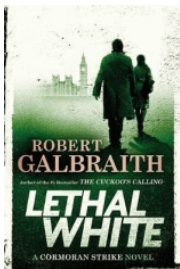
