

Baby/Toddler Storytime @ Milliken Mills, Nov 2nd, 2011: Vocabulary / I Know Words!

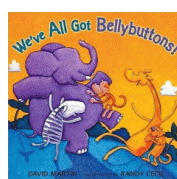

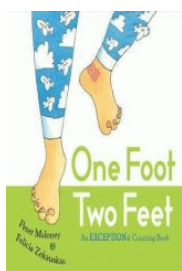

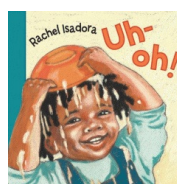

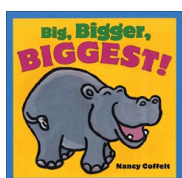
