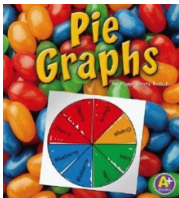


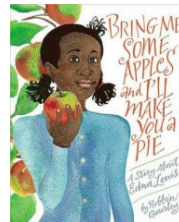
BKLYN Celebrate Pi Day

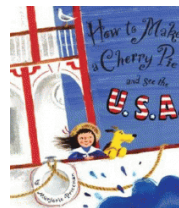

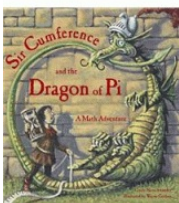

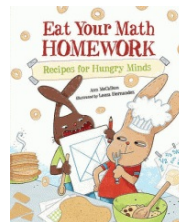

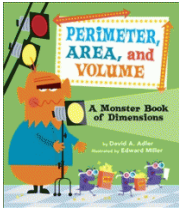

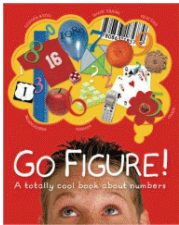
Perimeter, area, and volume

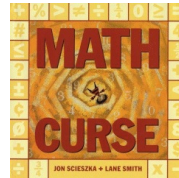
Ugly pie
