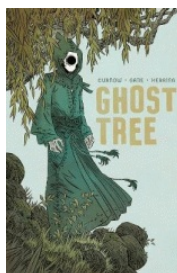

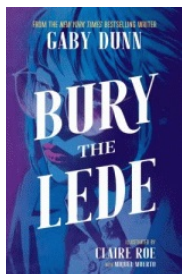
A woman and her husband navigate the apocalyptic currents of contemporary America.

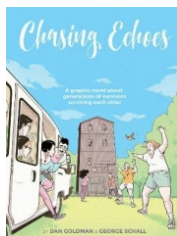
Visiting his grandmother in Japan, Brandt encounters his grandfather's spirit.

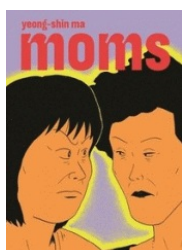
An intern at a Boston newspaper is caught up in a scandalous murder investigation.

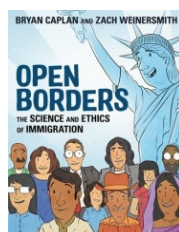

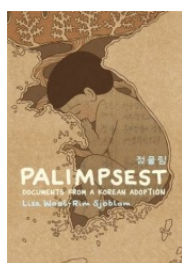

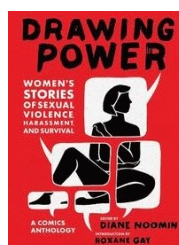
