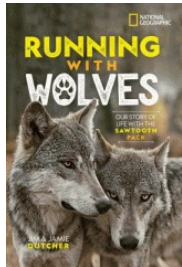

wolves, the threats that challenge their survival and why the species deserves protection.

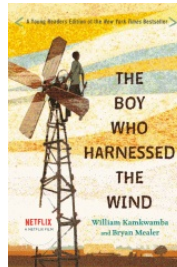


## Something rotten : a fresh look at roadkill

be useful in scientific research, from Tasmanian devil remains used in cancer research to red wolf remains used in genetic research and engineering.

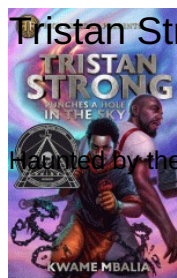


## The boy who harnessed the wind

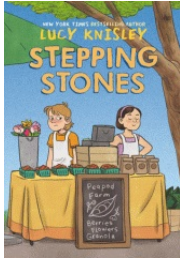

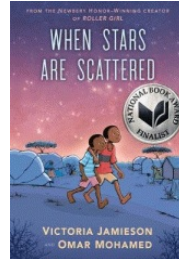

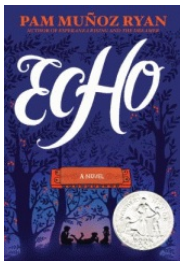


## When stars are scattered

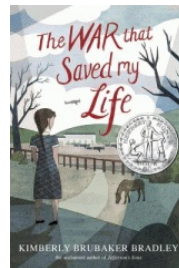
a refugee camp.
