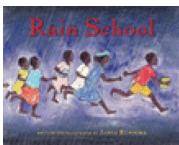

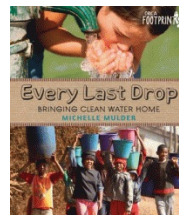

Rumford, James, 1948-

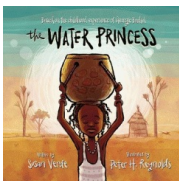
The children arrive on the first day of school and build a mud structure to be their classroom for the next nine months until the rainy season comes and washes it all away.

Mulder, Michelle, 1976-

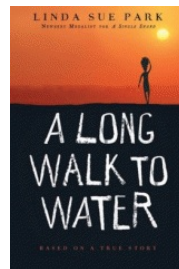
Clean water is a precious resource in a thirsty world. May be a bit dated (2014).

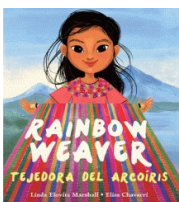

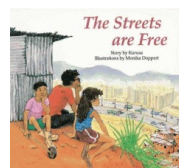

The streets are free

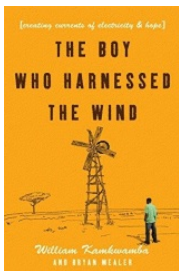
Kurusa.

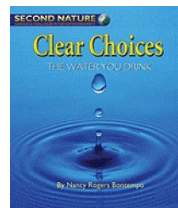


The boy who harnessed the wind : creating currents of electricity and hope

This immensely engaging tale relates how an enterprising teenager in Malawi builds a windmill from scraps he finds around his village and brings electricity, and a future,

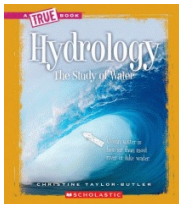
to his family.

Higgins, Matt.

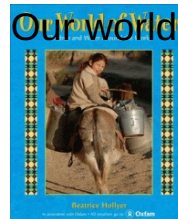
