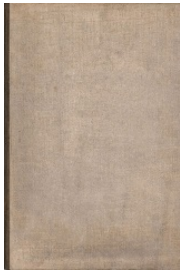

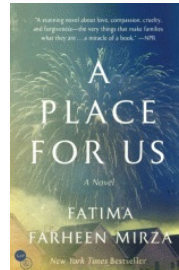


Before we visit the goddess [electronic resource] : A novel.

Three generations of mothers and daughters who must discover their greatest source of strength in one another—a masterful, brilliant tale of a family both

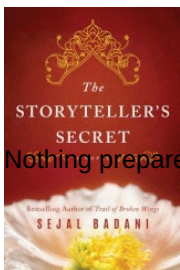

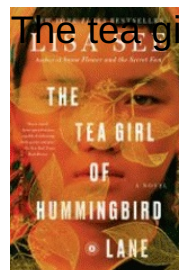
The storyteller's secret : a novel

See, Lisa.

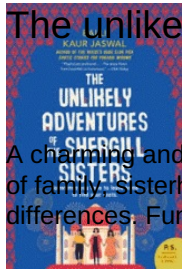
For the Akha people, ensconced in ritual and routine, life goes on as it has for generations—farming tea in a remote mountain village. Then a stranger appears

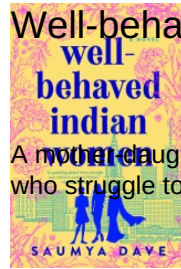
