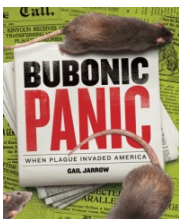


## All in a drop : how Antony van Leeuwenhoek discovered an invisible world

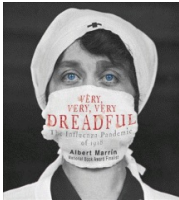

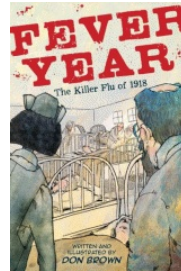

Marrin, Albert

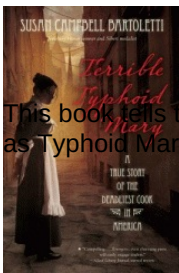
