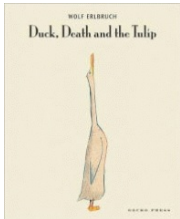


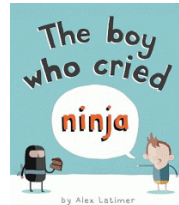
Great Picture Books for Teens and Adults

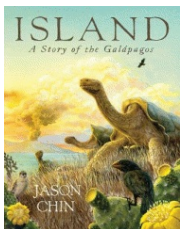

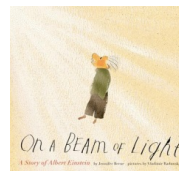

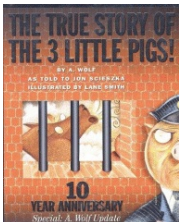

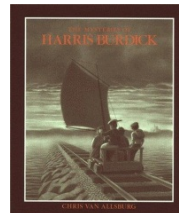
