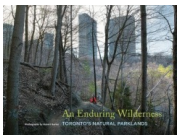


Rouge National Urban Park

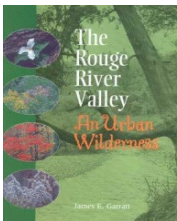
