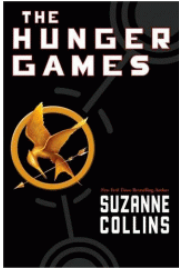


YA Science Fiction Series

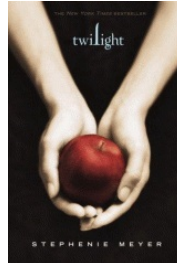


The hunger games

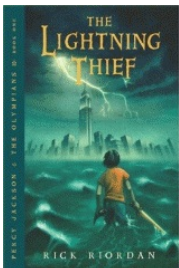


Twilight
