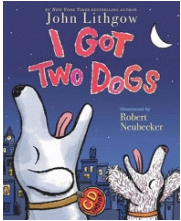


MPL: Books to Sing

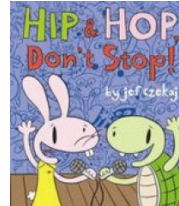

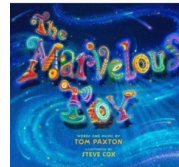

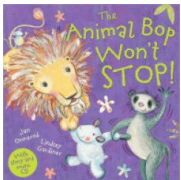

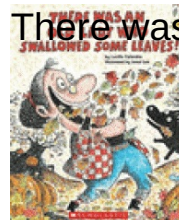
