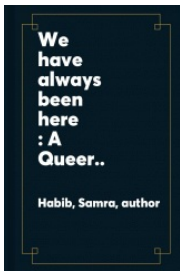

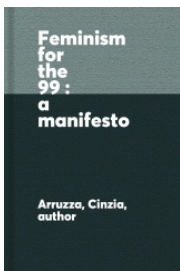

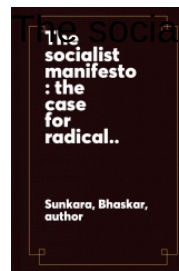


Feminism for the 99% : a manifesto

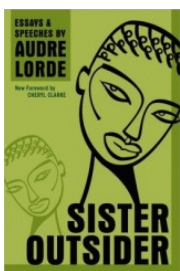
