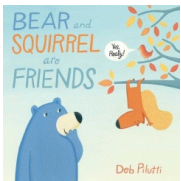


Unionville Library Storytime - October 13th 2017 - Squirrels!

Squirrel can climb trees, fox cannot. What's fox to do when Squirrel makes another friend capable of climbing trees?

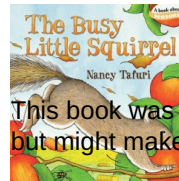
Everyone can relate to Fox a little bit as he thinks he's lost his best friend to some new person, but in the end the book shows it's more fun if everyone plays together.

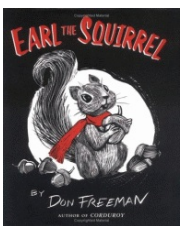
Rhyming books are always a treat at Storytime and this one is no exception. Lots of actions for little ones to mimic, so good for a restless crowd.
