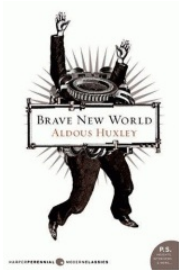


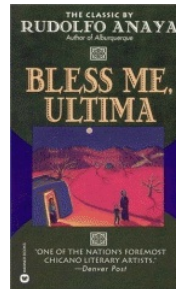
BKLYN Check It Out, Books For Teens: Banned Books Week

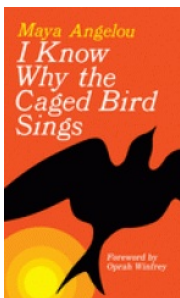

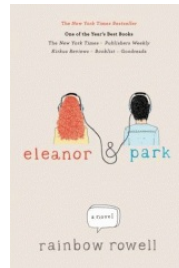
