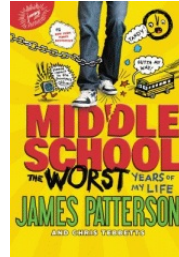

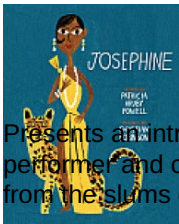


Middle school, the worst years of my life

words by Patricia Hruby Powell ; pictures by Christian Robinson.

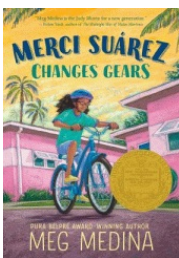
