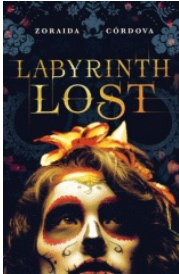

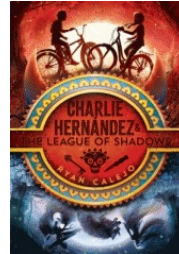


Labyrinth lost

Limbo and as strange...

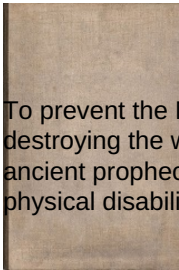


Charlie Hernández and the league of shadows
