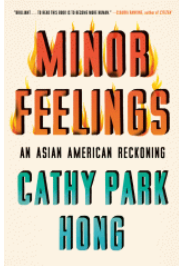

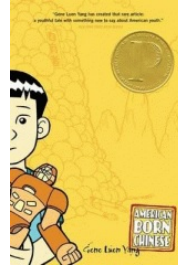


Minor feelings : an Asian American reckoning

female friendship in a search to both uncover and speak the truth.

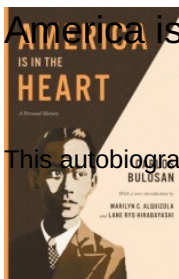


American born Chinese

rural West.

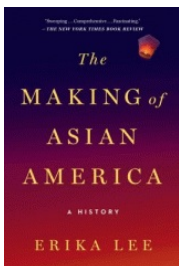


The Joy Luck Club
